It started in 1997 where "World Forum of Fish Harvesters & Fish Workers" met at New Delhi leading to formation of "World Fisheries Forum" with representatives from 18 countries and signed a declaration advocating for a global mandate of sustainable fishing practices and policies. The event aims to draw attention to overfishing, habitat destruction and other serious threats to the sustainability of our marine and freshwater resources. The celebrations serve to focus on changing the way the world manages global fisheries to ensure sustainable stocks and healthy ecosystems.

The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying has celebrated the 'World Fisheries Day' 2021 at Rail Auditorium, Bhubaneswar Odisha on 21st November, 2021. Hon'ble Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Shri Parshottam Rupala, Union Minister of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Dr. L. Murugan has graced the occasion. Various State Fisheries Departmental Officers, fish farmers, fishermen, fish farmers, entrepreneurs, stakeholders, professionals, officials and scientists from across the nation has participated in the event.









During the event, the awards were given to the Best Performing States for 2020-21 in the category of Inland, Marine, Hilly and North-eastern region, Best District for Inland, Marine, Hilly and North-Eastern Region, Best Federation/ Quasi Government Organization/ Corporation/ Board in Inland, Marine, Hilly and North-Eastern (NE) Region. Besides, this awards were also presented under Best Fish Farmer (Inland, Marine and Hilly and NE Region ), Best Hatchery(fish, shrimp and hatchery), Best Fisheries Enterprises, Best trout **Co-operative** Societies/Farmer Fisheries **Producer** Organisations (FPOs)/Self Help Groups (SHGs), Best Individual Entrepreneurs, best Innovation Idea/Technology Infusion. Hon'ble Union Ministers also released various publications of booklets, posters, Radio Jingles and technical sessions were held during the event. Foreseeing the potential of the sector, Hon'ble Prime Minister in May, 2020 had launched the







"Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) with a budget of over Rs. 20,050 crores for a period of five years. The Scheme aims to achieve fish production of 22 MMT from the current 13.76 MMT by 2024-25 and to create an additional employment opportunity to about 55 lakh people through this sector.











## **Inaugural Function**

The Hon'ble Minister of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying Shri Parshottam Rupala, Chief Guest inaugurated the World Fisheries Day celebration 2021 which was held at Rail Auditorium, Mancheswar, Bhubaneswar, Odisha. The event was attended by Dr. L. Murugan, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Shri Jatindra Nath Swain, IAS, Secretary, Dept. of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying; Minister Higher Education Dept. Government of Odisha Dr. Arun Kumar Sahoo ji, Special Secretary & FA, (Fisheries), Chief NFDB, Joint Secretaries (Fisheries), Executive. **Commissioner & Secretary, Odisha, Guests from Various** States, Officers of Dept. of Fisheries and other **Departments/Ministries State officers** and farmers attended the program.







The guests of the event were felicitated and welcomed with flower bouquets and ushered to the seats on the dais. The Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Fisheries led the lighting of traditional lamps followed by the delegates on the dais. Shri Jatindra Nath Swain, IAS, Secretary, delivered the welcome address followed by Keynote address.



## **Key note Address**

Shri Jatindra Nath Swain, Secretary, Shared that the thrust is more towards culture- oriented activities while ensuring the open water bodies are able to rejuvenate and sustain itself, creating about 43,905 ha of new rearing, grow out and renovation of ponds under CSS-**Revolution and PMMSY across the** Blue country touching every States and Union Territories covering additional area of 27,000 ha. For maximum resource utilisation, 1,668 ha. of waterlogged areas has been put to use. For more intensive farming through vertical expansion with high density and higher productivity, 2,054 RAS units, 992 Bio-floc units, 18,254 Cages are being established across the potential States.



PMMSY shall support for establishing 10,692 Nos. of cages additionally. Furthermore, to support the culture systems, the ancillary supporting input facilities such as feed mills, laboratories for soil and water test, health and disease testing, cold chain and marketing channels, cold store and ice-plants, marketing outlets, kiosks, retail and wholesale market etc. are provided.

Various types of diversification in terms of species, culture technologies and methods have been introduced for increasing production and productivity. Development of cold-water fisheries, ornamental and recreational fisheries, aquapark, brood banks etc are some important components under PMMSY. Could able to maintain export earnings with the interventions initiated. Centre introduced Fish Farmers' Producer Organisations (FFPOs). He shared about FIDF, credit facility with 3 % interest subvention which is being provided to enhance public and private investment in building infrastructure.







Government is taking initiatives in enhancing domestic fish consumption through wide publicity campaigns. Training, capacity building and outreach programmes have reached nearly 20.75 lakh fishers and fish farmers and other stakeholders. The success of this PMMSY scheme will benefits millions of farmers and fishers of our country and will also generate lots of fresh employment directly or indirectly.

## Address By Shri Parshottam Rupala Hon'ble Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, GOI



**Rupala** extended Shri his heartfelt greetings the on occasion of World Fisheries Day, 2021 as this special day carried lot of prospects in the life of everyone associated with fisheries and aquaculture sector. He shared that Fisheries sector plays an important role in the socio-economic development of India contributing around 1.24%.

to India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and 7.28 % to the Agricultural GDP. Fisheries and aquaculture continue to be an important source of food, nutrition, income and livelihood to millions of people.







He said states need to be inspired by each other and explore options to grow in marine sector. "There is a need to come up with environment friendly fishing and also look for sustaining the sector while continuing the consumption," said the Minister adding Government has set a target to achieve one lakh crore export from the sector by 2024-25. Shri Rupala called for greater awareness on Kisan Credit Card (KCC). "Our Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji has extended all possible support to the marine sector. The Government of India has already extended the support of KCC to the fishermen and women.



## Address by Dr. L. Murugan, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Gol



Minister of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Dr. L. Murugan said Prime that Minister Shri Narendra Modi ii. has envisaged a separate ministry for the fisheries sector and since then in a short span of time, the potential of the sector has been realized and the country now has set the ambitious target of achieving one lakh crore income from the sector. The Government is implementing Matsya Sampada Yojana and has infused Rs 20,000 crore





"in the sector through the scheme. Seaweed farming is another part where the government is putting more emphasis on and are also focusing on empowering fisherwomen and promoting entrepreneurship in the sector, He added saying that Paradip is among the five major ports being developed as Major Fishing Harbours.
